OUR DISTRICT

Pride and Passion are at the heart of everything we do at Wellsville Central School.

The district is woven into the fabric of the warm, tight-knit village of Wellsville. It is rich with assets and resources but is just as rich in community support. One doesn't need to look far to find someone to champion the cause of the district and its students.

Wellsville Central School prides itself on consistent delivery of curriculum at every grade level, providing students with well-planned, well thought-out instructional delivery from Pre-K-12th grade. Each student is provided an educationally sound program, emphasizing the subject area standards for each grade level and content area. Student engagement is primary focus through STEAM projects and technology integration in all grades and subject areas.

We used our State Smart Schools funds to purchase industry-recognized equipment to fill our STEAM Spaces. Through a half-million dollar building project, we were able to renovate existing footprint to expand and add STEAM spaces including a Fabrication Lab, Woods Lab, Metals Lab, Large Project Space, and a Presentation Space.

Project-Based Learning and Assessment continues to be a focus of the district, specifically our Secondary School. Wellsville is a part of the NYS PLAN pilot for project-based learning over the next few years.
